and by adjournment thereof from day to day, on the twelfth
day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty, two
before the Honorable William P. Peble & Nathan Weston Jr
Judge of said Court.

ON this twelfth day of June in the year 1820 personally appeared
in open Court

as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain
persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War,"
passed on the 18th day of March, 1818: and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any
property or securities, contracts, or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is con-
tained in the schedule hereunto annexed, and by me subscribed; that my occupation and ability to
pursue the same, together with the number and other particulars of my family, are in fact and in truth
as is herein particularly described, also subscribed by me.
